#### Press release

D.D.D.D. is pleased to present *Hangout*, a two person exhibition with artist and writer Justin Chance and the People of New York. Structured around three main works: *Hunger*, an eight foot wide quilt, *Kindness*, a floor installation surrounding documentation of a 2017 exhibition at the Royal Ontario Museum displaying the first fully preserved Blue Whale heart, and *Wall* titled after the Facebook feature of the same name. *Wall* is an ongoing collaboration with the People of New York of photographs taken after August 4, 2022.

The Blue Whale is the largest animal that has ever existed on Earth, New York City is the United States' most densely populated city and hunger is both a noun and verb.

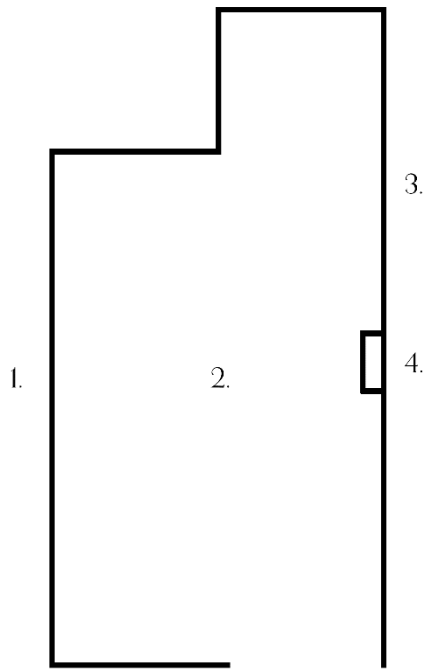
