



D. D. D. is pleased present *Tourniquet*, a new large-scale sculptural work by **Dylan Ahern** for NADA New York 2024, as part of the Rooftop Sculpture section.

In the work, Ahern is interested in the domestic quality and near ubiquity of the plastic storage bins and frames—the main structural element in which his sculpture is constructed. These basic building blocks, collectors of things to be accessed easily or forgotten about completely, form a framed structure holding various sculpted and found elements. Built from a mixture of iodized salt and urethane resin, a sphere sits near the top of the structure like a beacon, which is then supported by found flotation foam blocks that take on the paradoxical presence of both cold concrete and tree trunks mid decay.

Ahern imagines this work existing in rain, collecting, filtering, and draining water, similar to a fountain. The bins themselves are as much indoor as they are outdoor dwellers. Given the stacking capability of the frames and bins, the sculpture is modular, enabling it to respond to the space in which it's installed. Accompanied by the sphere and the bricks of foam, the whole structure withdraws from human contact. It becomes its own entity, collecting, filtering, and draining.

Artist Biography

Dylan Ahern (b. 1993, Long Island, NY) is an artist whose sculptural practice employs a variety of processes that include burning, melting, frying and casting, Ahern explores an inherent intimacy between people and material that works to reimagine the way objects are used and perceived. He completed his BFA from the University of Hartford in 2016 and MFA in Sculpture + Extended Media from the Virginia Commonwealth University in 2022. He was a cofounder of 891, a project space based in Providence, Rhode Island, dedicated to showcasing artists of varying career stages from 2018-2019. Recent exhibitions include a solo exhibition at Uotan, Mexico City, a two-person exhibition at D. D. D. D. New York, and group exhibitions at International Objects in Brooklyn, New York and DePillars Gallery in Richmond, Virginia, He currently lives and works as an artist and educator in Houston. Texas.
